NONPUBLIC SCHOOL ENROLLMENT REPORT  
SCHOOL TYPE AND PROGRAM DEFINITIONS**

**SCHOOL TYPE**

**Approved Private School for Students with Disabilities – Elementary/Secondary** - A facility organized to provide educational experiences for students who have been determined eligible for special education and related services with programs that span the traditional elementary and secondary grades.

**Approved Private School for Students with Disabilities – Secondary** - A facility organized to provide educational experiences for students who have been determined eligible for special education and related services with programs specifically directed to the traditional secondary grades.

**Approved Private School for Students with Disabilities – Elementary** - A facility organized to provide educational experiences for students who have been determined eligible for special education and related services with programs specifically directed to the traditional elementary grades.

**Kindergarten School** - A facility organized to provide education experiences for children immediately preceding entry into the first grade. A school providing experiences targeted towards preschool and kindergarten students is reported as a *Kindergarten School* under type.

**Elementary School** - A school classified as elementary by state and local practice and composed of any span of grade organization not above grade eight. A school with Pre-K/Nursery, Kindergarten, and any span of grades first through eighth is reported as an Elementary School under Type.

**Middle School** - An elementary school composed of any span of two or more grades that are not below fourth and not greater than eighth.

**Junior High School** - A separately organized secondary school with ninth grade the highest grade approved by the State Board of Education as intermediate between elementary and senior high school.

**4-Year High School** - A separately organized secondary school composed of the traditional ninth through twelfth grade span.

**6-Year High School** - A separately organized secondary school composed of grade span seventh through twelfth grades.

**3-Year High School** - A separately organized secondary school composed of grade span tenth through twelfth grades.

**Combined Elementary/Secondary School** - A school organized and administered under the leadership of one administrator to provide education experiences that span the traditional elementary and secondary grades.

## STATE PROGRAMS

**Nonpublic Textbook Aid** - A state funded program which purchases and loans textbooks to nonpublic school students.

**Nonpublic Nursing Services** - Chapter 226, Laws of 1991, approved July 26, 1991 requires a board of education in which a nonpublic school is located to provide nursing services to students who are enrolled full-time in the nonpublic school.

**Nonpublic Auxiliary Services Chapter 192** - A state funded program which provides services to eligible nonpublic school students in the areas of compensatory education; supportive services for acquiring communication proficiency in the English language for children of limited English-speaking ability; and home instruction.

**Nonpublic Handicapped Services Chapter 193** - A state funded program which provides services to eligible nonpublic school students in the areas of examination, classification, speech correction, and supplementary instruction.

**School Security Alert** - This is an email notification of an emergency threat at a public school.

## FEDERAL PROGRAMS

**National School Lunch Program** - This program provides state and federal funding to eligible sponsors for nutritious lunches served to nonpublic school students.

**Title I** –This program is funded to expand and improve programs and projects designed to meet the educational needs of educationally deprived children who live in areas having a high concentration of low-income families.

**Title II** –This is a program funded to prepare, train, and recruit high quality teachers and principals and to support technology in education.

**Title III** – This is a program funded to teach English language skills to limited English Proficient students and to assist them to meet the same challenging state standards required of all students.

**IDEA-B** – IDEA-B requires LEA's to expand a proportionate share of grant funds on services to students with disabilities enrolled in private schools by their parents.
